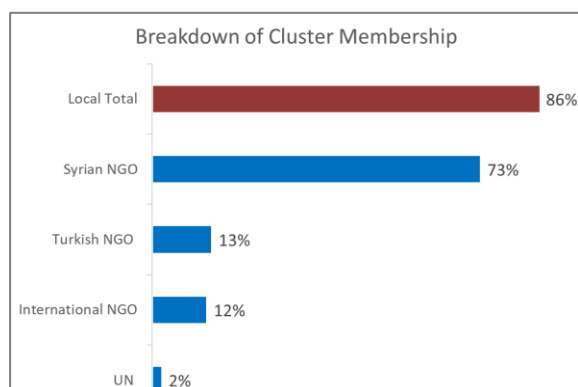


Gaziantep Education Cluster Localization Analysis, December 2019

Leadership and Membership:



The Education Cluster is co-led by **UNICEF** and **Save the Children**.

91 NGOs and UN organizations are members of the Cluster, carrying out cross-border Education in Emergencies (EiE) interventions in Northwest Syria.

86% of the members are Local or National NGOs (NNGOs), including Turkish or Syrian NGOs, 12% are INGOs, and 2% are UN agencies.

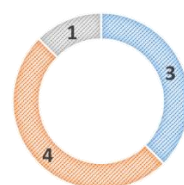
Cluster members can join decision-making mechanisms through membership to the **Strategic Advisory Group (SAG)** and **Vetting Committee** for Humanitarian Pooled Fund (HPF).

3 out of **8** SAG members are **NNGOs**, while 4 are INGOs and 1 is UN Agency.

The last **HPF Vetting Committee** had 8 members, and **2** of them were NNGOs, while 4 were UN and 2 were INGO.

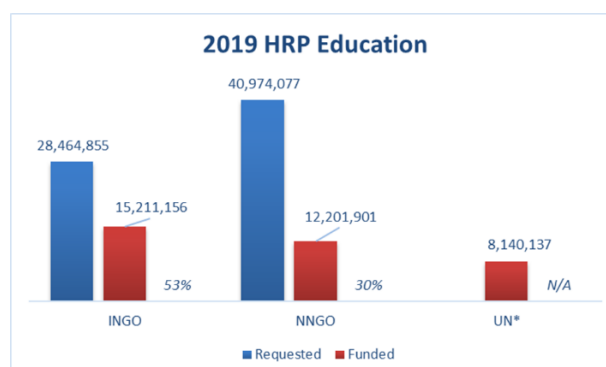
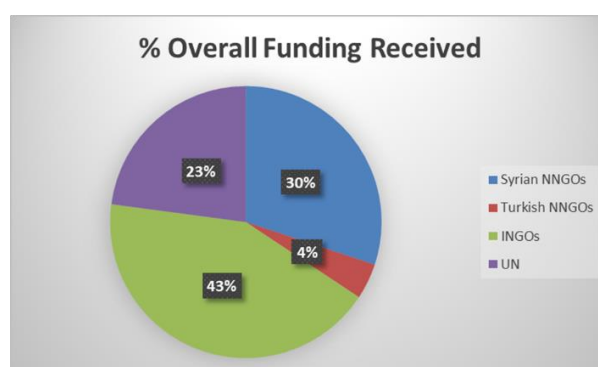
Funding Structure:

In 2019 HRP, the INGOs and NNGOs requested a total of **USD 60,6 million** in total.

NNGOs received **34%** of the total reported funding under HRP, while INGOs received 43% and UN Agencies received 23% of the total funding available for EiE.

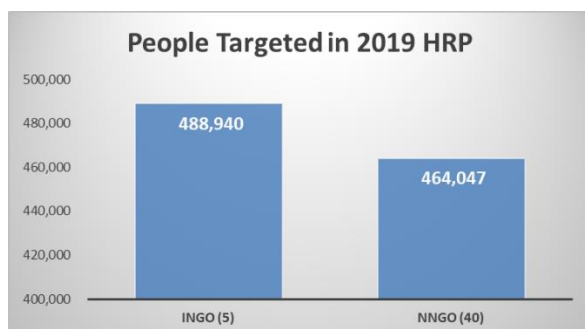
NNGOs were funded both directly and indirectly through INGOs, although projects were almost exclusively implemented by NNGOs, due to their capacity to access the field, manage security-related risks, and their experience in EiE.

In terms of funding requested vs received, INGOs were funded 53% of their appeals, while NNGOs only received 30%. Information on UN agencies could not be tracked.

Targeting People in Need (Children and Adults):



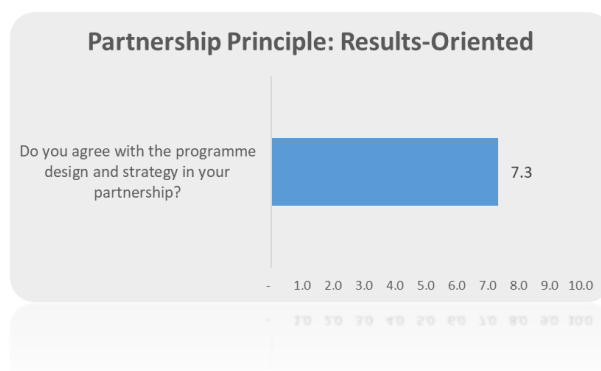
In terms of targeting a total of 953,000 people in need, 464,000 (49%) are targeted by 40 NNGOs, while 490,000 (51%) are targeted by 5 INGOs.

The general modality of implementation by INGOs is indirect implementation through partnering with an NNGO, while NNGOs are usually doing

Principles of Partnership:

In a partnership survey, cluster members scored 7.3 out of 10 for **inclusion in the design and strategy** of the partnership.

When 7 partnership agreements were reviewed, it was observed that the overall partnership modality is **sub-contracting**, and there were only **stand-alone institutional capacity-building** agreements. In general, **reporting is one-way** with **no flexibility in the budgets**.



Respondents, all national NGOs, expressed that **the risks to their staff is addressed to a lesser degree** than their partners' staff (5.8 vs 7.0).
